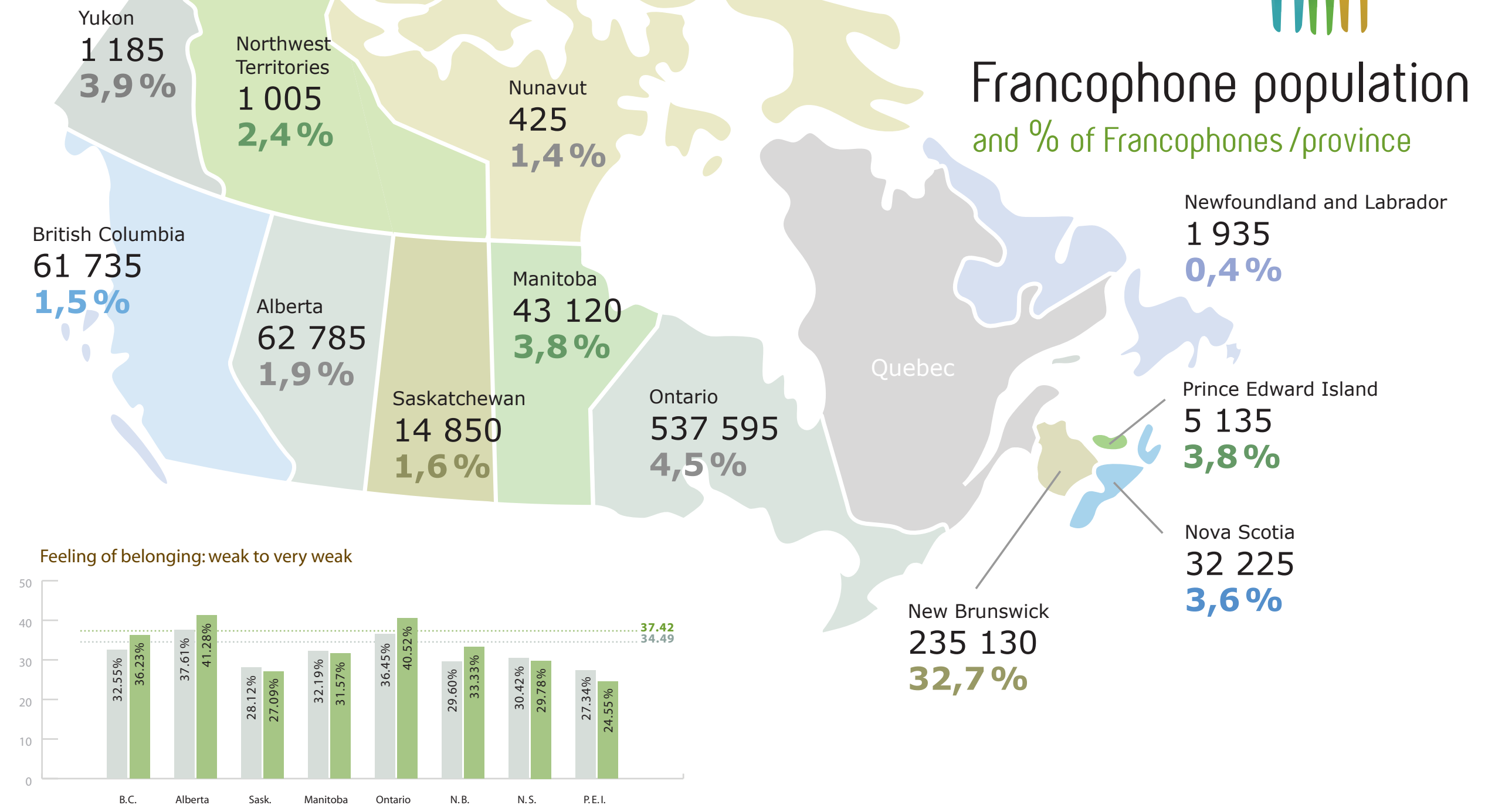
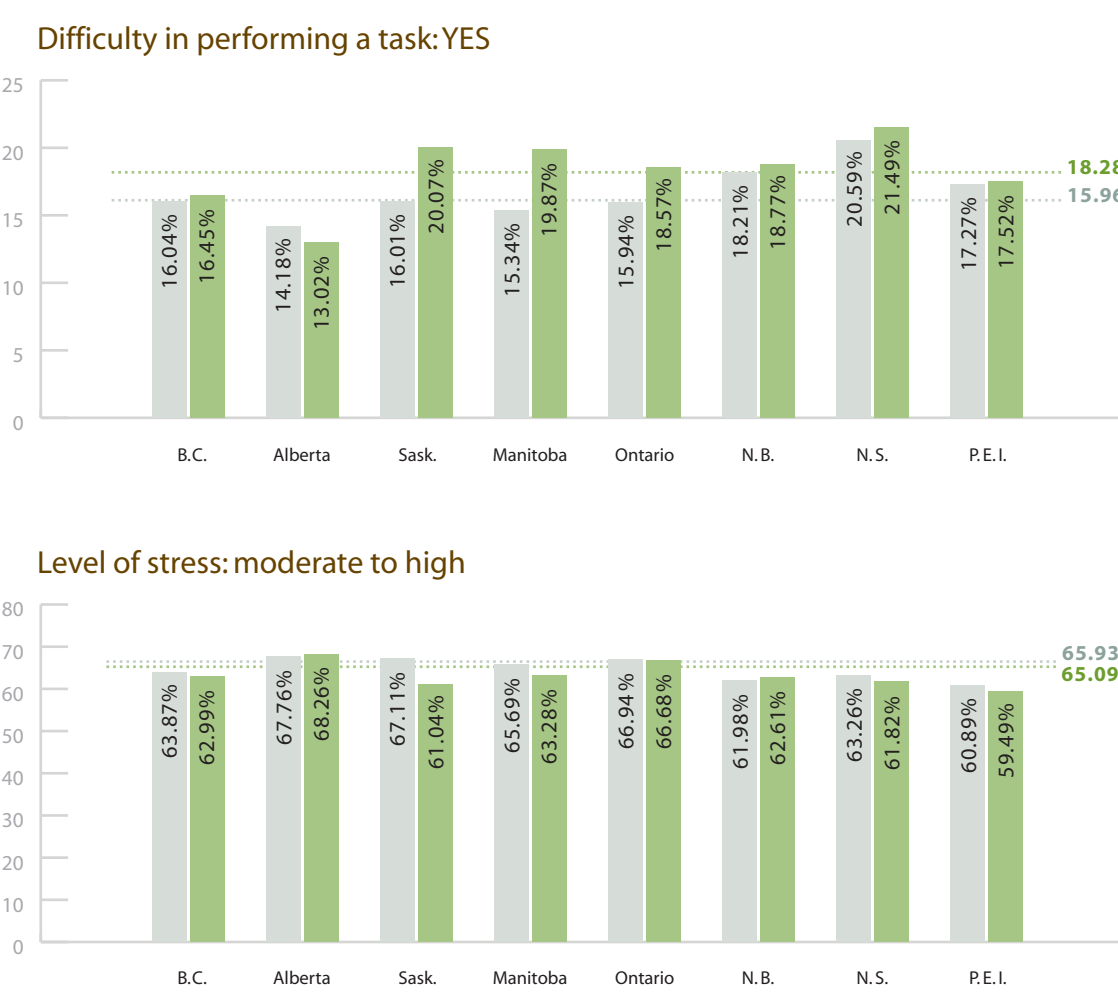
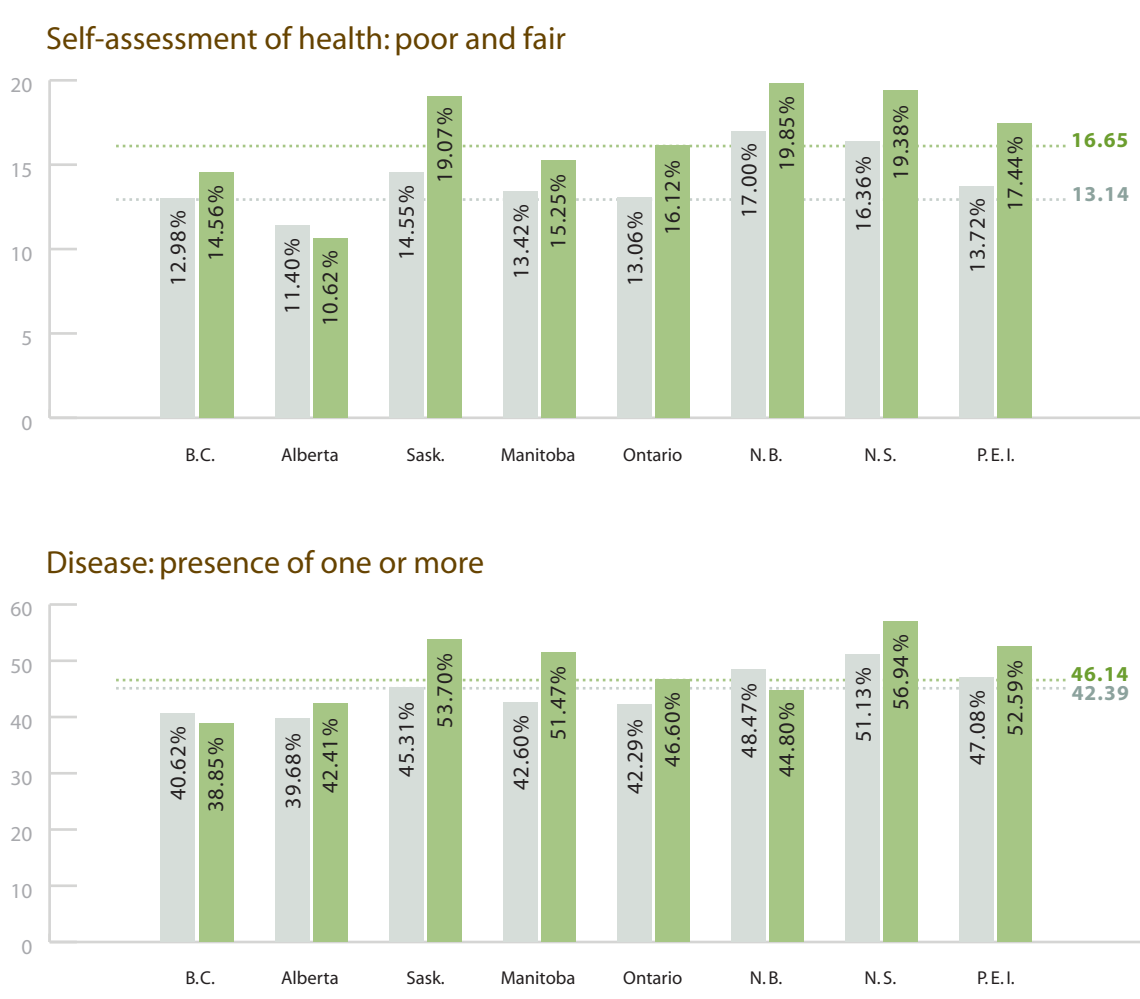
This poster presents a selection of indicators describing certain aspects of health determinants in the French-speaking minorities of various Canadian provinces.

These indicators are drawn from a secondary analysis of the Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS) with the 2001, 2003 and 2005 cycles combined. The weighted data are based on a sample of 256,966 people: 12,584 Francophones and 244,384 Anglophones. When sample size per province is too small, data are not available. This health profile shows the most adverse situations and determinants for the French-speaking minority relative to the English-speaking majority. This project was made possible through funding provided by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR).
